

### **\*RHS DRESS CODE:**

The school has a preferred dress code for senior yearbook photos. The dress code is recommended from the school- not Ed Clark Photography. Any questions about preferred dress code for photos needs to be given to the school.

**Boys:** It is recommended to wear a dress shirt with a tie for the yearbook session. (Dress-coat preferred)

**Girls:** It is recommended to wear the drape (which is provided) for the yearbook session. Please wear or bring a tank top (you must be able to pull the straps down over your shoulders), tube top, or camisole to wear under the drape.

### **\*GHS DRESS CODE:**

*Senior portrait attire must comply with the Glenwood High School dress code as outlined in the GHS Student Handbook (pg. 25).*

*Glenwood High School does not require specific clothing or formal attire for portraits; however, any portrait that violates the school dress code may not be published in the yearbook*

*While not required, traditional yearbook attire options remain available for students who would like to use them. These include a formal drape provided by the photographer or formal attire such as a dress shirt, tie, and/or dress coat. Students choosing to use the drape should wear or bring a tank top, tube top, camisole, or similar clothing item underneath. (You must be able to pull the straps down over your shoulders)*

*Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to discuss outfit choices prior to the portrait session. Glenwood High School and photographer Mr. Ed Clark are not responsible for attire changes made after a student leaves home or for clothing choices that differ from what was approved by parents/guardians.*
